Hōhonu kaki, pāpaku uaua

Long on words, short on actions

Learning how to count in Māori is obviously going to be critical as your knowledge of the language grows. It does take quite a bit of time and practice, but hopefully by the end of this week you will be familiar with the numeracy in te reo Māori.

Cardinal numbers used for counting are as follows:

Ordinal numbers used for ranking between one and nine, require the prefix *tua*:

Tuatahi	<i>First</i>
Tuarua	<i>Second</i>

Wāhanga tuarima	<i>Chapter five</i>
Kei te papa tuaono tōna whare	<i>His / Her apartment is on the sixth floor</i>

Ordinal numbers from 10 upwards require no prefix:

Tekau mā rima	<i>Fifteenth</i>
Tekau mā ono	<i>Sixteenth</i>
Rua mano mā tahi	<i>2001</i>
Rua mano tekau mā tahi	<i>2011</i>
Kotahi mano, iwa rau, waru tekau mā waru	<i>1988</i>

Rāapa – Wednesday

When asking about how many items or objects there are, use **e hia**.

E hia ngā āporo?

How many apples are there?

E whitu ngā āporo

There are seven apples

E hia ngā matimati?

How many fingers?

E rima ngā matimati

There are five fingers

E hia ngā hōiho?

How many horses are there?

Kotahi te hōiho

There is one horse

Hia is a question word and it means *how many*. In the examples above, you have also been introduced to the Māori word for *the*. There are two forms, a singular form **te** and a plural form **ngā**. So when you are talking about one item or object you use **te**, and more than one you use **ngā**. Therefore, **te** will always follow the number **kotahi**, and **ngā** will follow all other numbers because they will always be more than **tahi**, or one. So, when indicating there is only one, **kotahi** is used, irrespective of whether it indicates people or objects.

Kotahi te rangatira *There is only one leader*

Kotahi te whakautu *There is only one answer*

Kotahi te māngai mō tātou *There is only one spokesperson for us*

Kotahi te rongoā *There is only one remedy*

waru tekau mā waru

When asking the question *how many*, always use the plural form **ngā**, like this, **e hia ngā** ... If you use **e hia te** ... then you are already saying there is one object, so what is the point of asking?! When you answer the **e hia** question, simply remove the question word **hia** and replace it with the correct number.

Kia hia ngā pukapuka (māu)? *How many books (do you want)?*

Kia whitu ngā pukapuka (māku) *Seven books (for me)*

Kia hia ngā inu (māu)? *How many drinks (do you want)?*

Kia rua tekau mā whā ngā inu. *Two dozen (twenty-four)*

Hōmai kia kotahi te tōtiti, kia rua ngā hēki

(Can I have) one sausage and two eggs

You will notice the words **māu** (for you) and **māku** (for me) have been placed in brackets. This is because these words will be analysed in more depth as your expertise with te reo Māori develops.


