Year 0-2 - Basic Needs and Body Care & Physical Safety

Year 3-4 – How can we manage our big emotions?

- How can I be a good friend/teammate?
- How can I recognise and identify my emotions and strategies for managing these?
- How to identify the qualities of a good friend and team mate

Year 5-6 - How do we adapt to certain situations? How can we show resilience?

- How do our brain and emotions work?
- How do I deal with changes?
- How we can take care of our own hauora?

Year 7-8 –Physical Development and Growth

- Our students will learn to describe the characteristics of pubertal change and discuss positive adjustment strategies.
- Identify the factors that affect personal, physical, social and emotional, and growth
- The aakonga/students will develop skills to manage change.

School Attendance

I have been talking at PB4L Assemblies about the importance of attending school regularly.

Last Term, we had Peri Mura, the only aakonga to attend at a 100% rate!

This was sensational and I am pleased to say we now have 62 tamariki (20%) sitting at 100% attendance halfway through our term.

Better than this, I rewarded 48 students with a certificate and prize for 90% or better attendance at the end of Term 2.

As of week 6 of the term I could reward 121 (39%) of our aakonga with certificates and prizes.

I am so pleased!!!
