
There is school as usual on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and then we are into our final week of Term 1, 8-12 April.

- Review our growing roll numbers and seek further teaching spaces from the Ministry of Education
- Seek further Professional Development as a Board by attending the New Zealand
 School Trustees Annual Conference in Wellington in June
- Secure assistance in applying for grants to provide improved resources and facilities for our tamariki
- Reviewed the Asbestos Management Plan for Pukekohe North School
- Ensured all staff were fully registered and were up to date with their First Aid Training.
- Discussed developing a new Website to provide for the two curriculums taught at Pukekohe North School.

ATTENDANCE

Thank you to all the parents/caregivers who are contacting the school when your child is absent. Remember you can phone (09) 238 8552 or email attendance@pukekohenorth.school.nz to explain the reason as to why your child is absent. Please say your child's full name, room number, reason why they are away, and what day they will be back at school. If you are unable to contact the school on the day, please write a note for your child to bring to the office on their return date. This year we are focusing on improving our attendance percentage. Keep an eye out for the updates. Children should only be kept home from school if they are sick. Below are some solutions to common problems we come across.

CELL PHONES AT SCHOOL

As you will be aware, the Government is employing the 'Phones Away for the Day' policy as of Day 1 Term 2.

This is mandatory and schools are expected to comply with this process.

Pukekohe North School has allowed Year 7-8 aakonga to bring their phones to school BUT hand them into their teachers for safekeeping until the end of the school day.

We intend to follow this process from Term 2 and we seek whanau's feedback about our process or any thoughts you might like to share.

LEARNING SUPPORT POSITION STILL AVAILABLE

We are seeking two Learning Support / Teacher Aides for a Year 5-6 and Year 7-8 class in our Kura Ruumaki.

We wish to employ permanently for these classes.

We are offering 25 hours work per week to suitable applicants. Please note Teacher Aides do not receive pay during our holiday breaks.

Whilst we would prefer applicants with experience in working with tamariki, we must have applicants that are Police Vetted and competent speakers of Te Reo Maori.

POLICE VETTING (reminder)

Our School policy is that whananu involved in school trips/ excursions or events must be Police Vetted.

If you are wishing to support the tamariki outside of the school or for overnight events, can I urge you to apply for a Police Vet to safe guard our aakonga.

This process can take several weeks so apply early before kaiako begin requesting whaanau support. Vetting forms are available through the school office staff.
